5. Matters arising from Minutes of 23rd October meeting.

The crime figures for 2017 were down slightly on 2016, although Arson was up a fraction.

It was suggested that young arsonists be put on courses with the Fire Service.

6. Speeding. Roughton stands out with its high speeding numbers (traffic mainly from the Aylsham area)

Terry Brown brought up the recent accident outside the church in Trimingham. As a result several people in that village want to volunteer to do a Speedwatch. Terry will speak to PC Davidson re training, etc. (Perhaps they could join up with Sidestrand and Overstrand). David Law, Highways Manager is looking at speeding in Trimingham.

Drivers using mobile phones are now being checked in Norfolk and Suffolk.

High Visibility Patrols. Police are out where and when they can to include the Bus Lane.

7. Speedwatch. 23/09/17 to 06/12/17 It was observed from these results that 4-6% of traffic breaks the speed limit.

8. Public Participation. A member of the public mentioned that there are many more deer being hurt or killed on our roads. Highways need to look at this problem. Drivers have been seen deliberately running over deer followed by other drivers either leaving the injured deer to suffer or running it over again. There are many callous drivers around the county.
